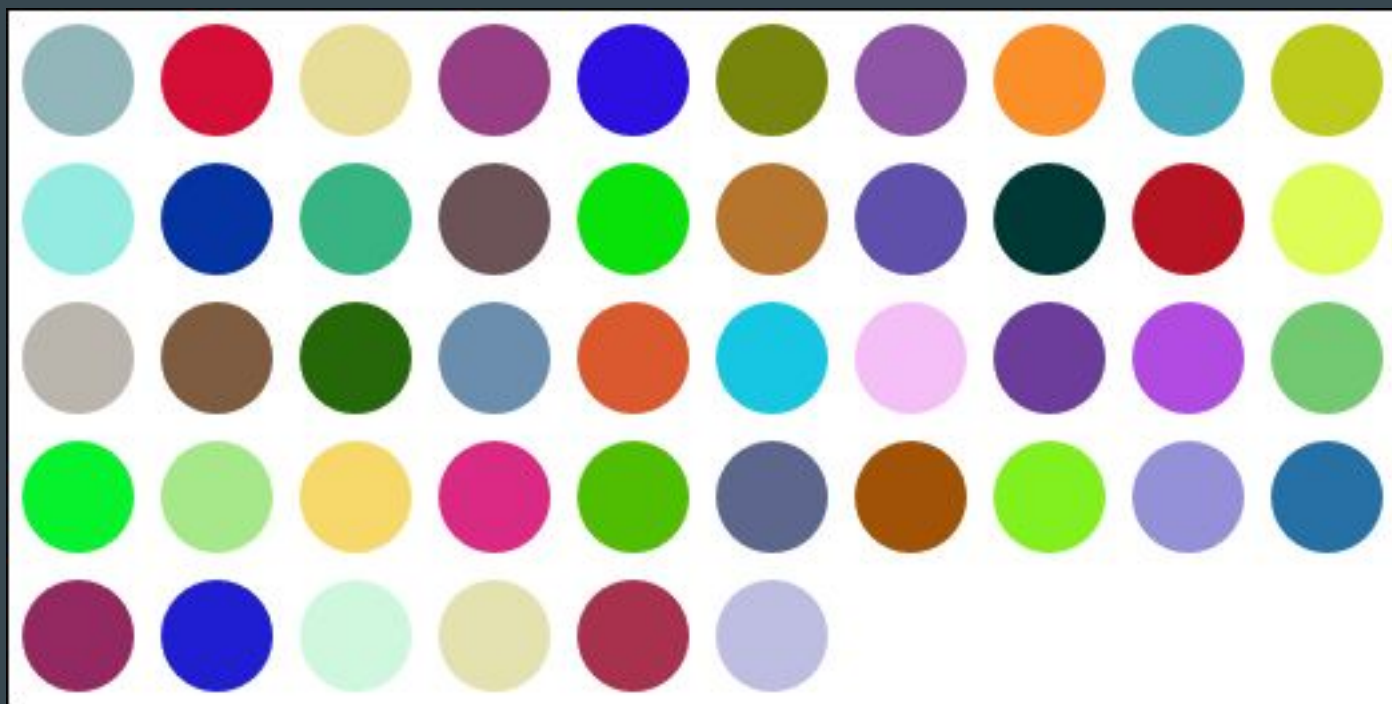
371 of the 1,671 people without a home counted in 2017 are under the age of 18.

There is 15 shelters in Jackson county, but most have requirements.

During the 2017-18 year, 938 students qualified for services for poor living conditions.

Over 30% of homes in our district make less than \$25,000, and 71.1% of students (about 10,200) qualify for free or reduced lunch.

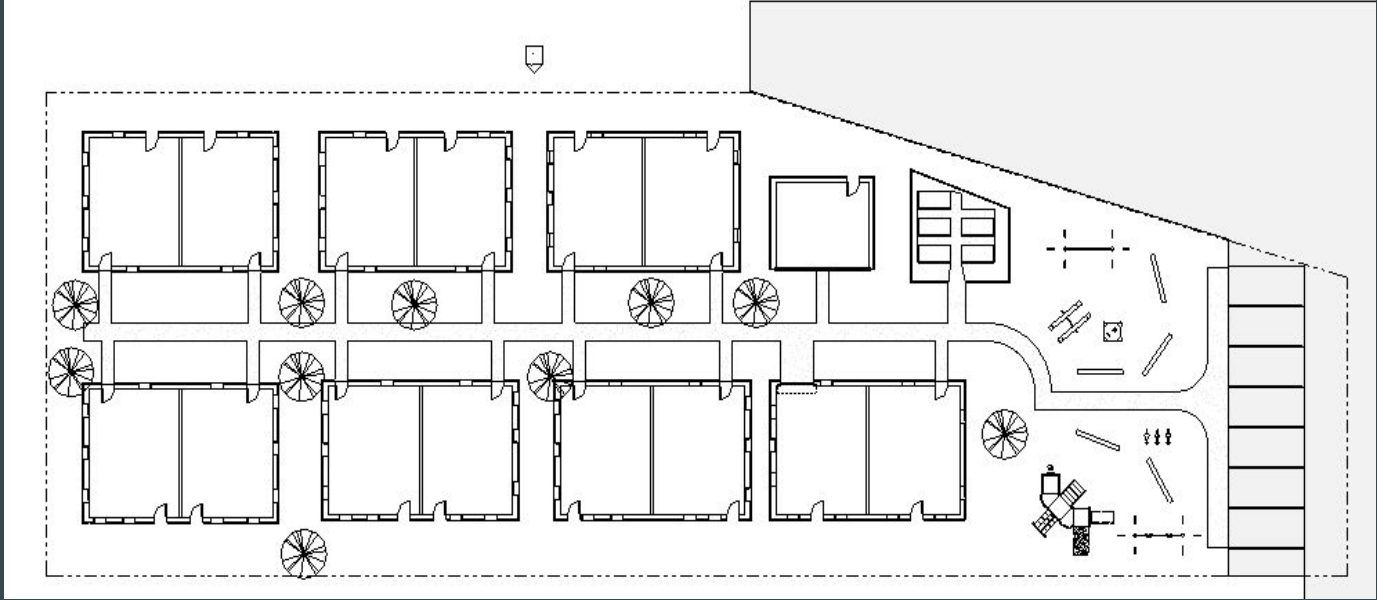
Students living in poverty are 2 to 3 times more likely to become chronically absent.



The resources we have

Currently, we have the help of students in History, Geometry, Architectural Drafting, Interior Design, Science, Culinary, STEM, and English classes to get the project started. There were 237 students were involved and over 12 teachers.

We have an interior design plan, samples, plot/housing pictures and labels.





Our plan

Steps 1-2: review plans in class and the current codes and regulations of the city

Steps 3-5: scale the city and draw the plan and explore the needs of the intended client

Steps 6-8: make a decision about how to build the plan and transfer it to REVIT, then send a student to demonstrate the planner to the interior design class

Step 9: finish the plan's details and insert attributes into it :)

Step 10: collaborate with the architectural drafting crew and figure out what resources we need to carry the project out

Our ask

Our mission is to create an awareness of what it is like to be displaced, hungry and on the streets right here in Independence. Through research driven data it is our intent to provide the city with not only an awareness of the issues that people that are living in uncertainty must contend with but to also present a solution to this problem in the Independence area.
